- E. Teacher's Report

K: The kindergarten teachers are both eager and anxious as we started the school year with distance learning. Since the class lists were not finalized when we began the year, all three K classes had a combined morning meeting for the first two days of school. The teachers then spent the remaining portion of the days doing assessment with individual students. We had our final class lists on 8/17 and started live meetings with our own class on that day. We have sent home learning materials to the families on 8/18 and had a good time doing our very first virtual Back to School Night.

1st: We've started distance learning and materials will be distributed on the 18th. We met with the families and did Literably assessment. We have started Zhuyin review materials from KangXuang and Xue Huayu Kai Bu Zou. Go Math- Chapter 1. This week, we will have two more days of assessment. Completed Zhuyin assessment. We also had Pre-on demand writing on the genre Small moment. Math-iReady, Reading-Literably and iReady, also worked on ImagineLL. SEL-Read books-Ex.(*Diversity Ninja -By Mary Nhin*), and shared materials created by the summer collaboration group. We also completed primary spelling inventory.

2nd:

- We have started distance learning and distributed materials on the 24th!
- Met all the families and provided families with a year plan, curriculum, teachers' expectations... during BTSN.
- Worked on Zhuyin, Writing and Reading assessment through whole group and small groups.

- Took the iReady Math and Reading diagnostic tests, Literably reading assessment, Imagine Language & Literacy assessment, and the primary spelling inventory.
- Have our regular daily morning meeting, set up routines and daily Seesaw activities are assigned to students.
- Whole group and small group meeting schedules are linked to Google classroom calendar to make students easier to attend our meetings.

- Practiced using the Google Classroom as LMS (Learning Management System)
