E. Teacher's Report

K: Kindergarteners spent some time reviewing the zhuyin and Chinese characters as we return from the Winter Break. We moved on to a new Kang Xuan Chinese lesson and continued our zhuyin learning. We also continued the GO Math curriculum, as well as Reader's workshop and Writer's workshop. We kicked off a new unit of science with the second workbook. We are excited about introducing the Chinese New Year and distributing the CNY materials on our next pick up day, January 27.

1st: -MeiZhou Huayu-we are working on lessons 9, 10, 11 and 12this month. Lesson 12 is a little lengthier than others, so we will spend two weeks on that lesson. GoMath- we are working on Chapters 5, 6 and parts of 7 for this month. We will continue on in the writer's workshop and reader's workshop. As for science, we are working on the next unit. We will also have simple paper cutting activities for Chinese New Year. The distribution of the materials will be on January 27th.

2nd: English: We are continuing our reading unit on becoming experts (nonfiction) and our writing unit on nonfiction writing. Math: We started chapter 5 about 2-digit subtraction. Science: We're starting Segment 3: Landscape Changes, Topic 4: Earth's Processes.

Chinese: We are working on Meizhou Lesson 6 and will be working on Lesson 7 about Spring and Chinese New Year. Social Studies: we finished the MLK booklet and we are working on My family history project. Writing: introduce informational writing, how to choose a topic and collect information; Reading: Level Chinese (strategies to get information from the pictures)

3rd: English Reader's Workshop: We continue to learn strategies for summarizing the main idea and supporting details when reading nonfiction expository texts. English Writer's Workshop: We are drafting our information chapter book, thinking about organization and structure. Math: We are practicing different strategies for division. Science: We are working on the life cycles and traits unit.

Chinese: We reviewed Meizhou Lesson 1-4 and we are working on Lesson 5. In reading workshop: we have introduced the text features of informational texts and we are working on retelling informational texts and identifying the different ways of explanation. In writing workshop, we have introduced the genre of fantasy writing and the sub-genres of fantasy and we are studying a few masterpieces in children literature and learning about the fantasy elements in them. Social studies: we are working on the development of the local community: change over time.

4th:

Chinese: We are learning MeiZhou Chinese lesson 5 on topics about food-making dumplings and the story of stone soup. Social Studies: We will finish Unit 1 on California geography and share photos about traveling/living in California

English: Finishing up Chapter 4 division. Writing a literary essay about a character and finding theme. Reading fiction and picking out narrative elements.

5th:

Chinese: We just finished MZHY lesson 6 - The Food Pyramid. Students are currently taking another round of Level Chinese informational reading assessment. We have also finished social studies unit 3 - Fight for the Continent. For writing, students are working on their first informational piece. They chose one or two strategies for grabbing readers' attention in their first paragraph and practiced skills for organizing information. English:

Math: Just finished Go math lesson 5

Writing: Ending Literary Essay

Reading: Ending Interpretation BBook Clubs.

Science: End instructional segment 4. From Matter to Organisms.

Modeling Food Web PBL.

A. 2021-2022 Budget Prep (Kevin, David C.)

CLIPCO board, teachers, MCAC/MiCAC, School Administration work together to create proposed budget

Proposed budget is presented and reviewed by board

Funding the budget comes from DGC and/or Reserves

If there is surplus, board votes on putting in reserves or supplemental fund Supplemental fund allows principals and CAC's to operate more freely having an additional funding source and prevents the "use it or lose it" mentality Reserves are healthy at 1.6x at FY End 2019-2020

Reserves and Supplemental Fund gives stability

Delay vote on moving \$44k to Supplemental Fund to next month

Recommend \$250k DGC target based on 2020-2021 participation rates (in the low 80%) and also unknown impact from parcel tax, lower corporate matching, keeping the DGC ask flat for another year

2020-21 DGC is 2 278k which includes abnormal 2x corp match (\$83k expected corp match, including onetime grant of \$15k)

80% participation is usually considered good

B. Parcel Tax \$999 donation and endorsement ask from CUSD United (Alan) Parcel tax will be on the May ballot

Donation goes to yard signs, marketing materials

\$999 was chosen for taxes
