2.5. Teacher's Report

Kindergarten

We finished all of the Kangxuan Text Lesson 1-Lesson 10. Students have reviewed all zhuyin symbols and begun to write. We also introduced Meizhou Textbooks. Now we are teaching lesson 5. April 22nd is Earth Day. Students are learning the theme book: My Earth. Connected to the social study, students have learned about landforms. This month and next month students will have two field trips: Park Day and Fire Station. We continue to work on Writer's Workshop and Reader's Workshop in our classes. This month we will work on Opinion writing. In math we begin to teach shapes: rectangle, triangle, square, circle. Then we will move on to GO Math chapter 9 & Chapter 10.

1st

In Chinese, we have finished our Meizhou Huayu curriculum and are currently reviewing these lessons. We are also working on KangXuan XiaCe Lessons 1-4. In Math, we are finishing up our unit on measurement and data. We will be working on GoMath Chapters 10-12. In English, we are finishing our All About(Informational) papers.

(April 26)- Starting this week, in English writing, we have completed informational writing and will be working on Scenes to Series. As for Math, we will be working on Chapters 11 and 12. We are working on KangXuan Lessons 3-4.

2nd

Chinese, we have finished Meizhou informational writing and working on opinion writing. We are currently working on Meizhou lesson 9. In social studies, we are working on our community.

3rd

English: We are getting ready for CAASPP testing while continuing the opinion writing unit and two-dimensional shapes math unit.

4th

Chinese: In MZHY Chinese, we are learning Lesson 8 which is about the planets in the Solar System. For writing, we are

starting narrative writing. For Social Studies, we are on unit 2 Early People in California / unit 3 Gold Rush.

English: In English, we are preparing for the CAASPP tests by reviewing the content we learned this year as well as going over test taking strategies. Students are finishing up ch. 12/13 in math, our final units. They are also creating non-fiction books about the CA missions (that will be displayed at our Open House). Students are currently studying the Rock Cycle in science.

5th

Chinese: 5th graders have completed the AAPPL test. We are starting MZHY lesson 9 about the American Indian Museum and Chief Seattle. This lesson also connects to American history they've learned in social studies in the second trimester. In social studies, students are learning about the American Revolutionary War. In writing, we are launching opinion writing as the writing genre for the third trimester.


PTA spend what they have, can only carryover what they will spend (40k reserve now)
